A Life Restored...



Jon Hutcherson came to the mission in September of 2013 after fighting a long battle with chronic pain and severe depression. During the month prior to coming to the Mission, Jon had tried to commit suicide multiple times. Looking back, Jon remarked, "EVERY time this happened, God sent someone to interrupt what I was doing, unbeknownst to them."

Upon arriving at the Winston-Salem Rescue Mission, Jon was given food, shelter, and the support of others who cared. Shortly after beginning the 90-day Life Builders Program, he rededicated his life to Christ. He found the depression lightened and the suicidal

tendencies lessened. After completion of this program he found himself wanting more. He applied for and was accepted into the 1-year Transformers Program, graduating in the fall of 2014.

"The Winston-Salem Rescue Mission saved my life and the least I can do is to give back by working with the homeless and hurting here at the Mission." Jon Hutcherson

Jon says, "During a time when I was homeless, jobless, hopeless, estranged from my family and thought I had no place to turn, the Winston-Salem Rescue Mission was there to help. I experienced a sense of real love and caring from a staff drawn by the Lord to help those in need. I received the practical and spiritual guidance I needed, as well as the physical comfort and security necessary to grow and thrive while rebuilding a shattered life."

If you have entered the doors of the New Life Center, you have probably been greeted by the smile and welcoming words of Jon Hutcherson. In March of this year, Jon moved from the Phone Room at the Mission Building to become the full-time Receptionist at the New Life Center. His personality brings a warm welcome to those who enter through our doors. He is a shining example of a life transformed through the work of the Winston-Salem Rescue Mission.

Who doesn't love fresh vegetables? **Alpha Acres** A Place of New Beginnings

A donation of seeds and fertilizer from **Swan Creek Farm Supply** to the Winston-Salem Rescue Mission program at **Alpha Acres** has provided the means for Mike Lynn, Work Therapy Supervisor, to teach the men not only how to farm, but also life skills such as trust, teamwork, and making positive choices. This, coupled with Bible study, educational and recovery classes, and one-on-one counseling helps break the cycle of addictive behavior and selfish living. Just like the seeds that are planted, nurtured and harvested, so the lives of men are radically changed through the Alpha Acres program.

The vegetables from the farm help feed the men at both Alpha Acres and the Winston-Salem campuses and are sold at a produce stand near the farm with proceeds from the sale helping fund the Alpha Acres programs. Extra vegetables are canned and frozen for use during the winter months.
